WHAT TO KNOW



WHAT IS IT

- Monkeypox (MPX) is an infectious disease caused by a virus similar to smallpox, but less severe
- Outbreaks are occurring in several countries, including Italy
- Most of the cases involve men who have had sex with men (MSM), but anyone can transmit or contract the virus
- The disease usually lasts from 2 to 4 weeks, with complete recovery



HOW IT IS TRANSMITTED

- By direct contact with skin and/or mucous membrane lesions or body fluids
- During sexual activity
- In prolonged face-to-face situations, through saliva droplets
- Touching contaminated objects (such as clothing, towels, bed linen, dishes)



WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS

- Eruptions with blisters on the whole body (most frequent in ano-genital areas)
- Fever
- Enlarged lymph nodes
- Rectal inflammation and pain

These symptoms may be accompanied by headaches, muscle aches and weakness



WHAT TO DO IN CASE OF SUSPECTED INFECTION

- Contact your doctor immediately
- Self-isolate and do not-take part to events
- Do the test, if prescribed
- Abstain from sexual activity and avoid close or intimate contact until the disease is ruled out
- Warn close contacts and sexual partners
- Wash hands frequently
